Please make sure all your contact details and notice of any eligible adults to pick up your child are up to date.

If your child is off sick please leave a message on the absence line, otherwise the absence will be marked as unauthorised.

Any inhalers/epipens are the responsibility of parents to ensure they are in date and handed to your child's class teacher.

In addition if any of your children have an allergic reaction to wasp or bee stings, you must inform the school office immediately. We will always contact you if your child does get stung, so that Piriton or sting relief cream can be administered with your permission.
