RE IMPACT STATEMENT



At Worlingham CEVC Primary School our RE curriculum promotes inquisitive minds, respect, tolerance and understanding for all people including ourselves. We want pupils to have meaningful, informed interactions with people of different beliefs, both religious and non-religious throughout their education and into their adult lives.

We follow the Emmanuel Project 2020 created by the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich. The children are taught a different RE unit from the Emmanuel project each half term. In the EYFS each RE unit focuses upon an aspect of Christianity. In KS1 and 2 children are taught Christianity and other world religions. By the time our pupils reach the end of Key Stage 2 they have learnt about all the world religions, including the non-religious philosophy of Humanism.

We use a variety of teaching strategies to teach the units including, discussions, stories, writing, drama, music and art. Teachers take time to explain key vocabulary which is displayed in each classroom for children to refer to. In the EYFS children's work is recorded through observations, photos, writing and art work. In KS1 and KS2 all children have an RE book which the children take pride in recording their work.

At the end of each unit children are assessed using the assessment from the Emmanuel programme. The children reflect on key learning through the Emmanuel taxonomy hexagons, questions and quizzes. All of these assessment activities ensure teachers have good knowledge of pupils who are developing, on track or excelling in RE.

The RE subject leaders monitor the impact of RE teaching by, monitoring RE books and displays, talking to children about their learning through pupil voice activities, lesson observations and drop-in's, often with monitoring governors and staff training.

Pupils' enjoy their RE lessons at Worlingham CEVC Primary School. Pupil voice activities convey the value and importance of RE lessons at our school. Younger children said RE teaches them about love and respect. Older children commented on RE teaching them about world religions and the importance of understanding peoples' beliefs and ways of life.
